**Who:** Dehesa Student in grades K-12, siblings and ONE parent chaperone are welcome.

**What:** Journey back in time and tread in the footsteps of the padres, soldiers, and settlers who established the first mission and presidio in Alta California. Students are led through a section of Presidio Park, discovering the plaza, stables, jail, chapel, and commander's house that lie protected underground today.

Inside the Serra Museum, students investigate artifacts that reveal the daily life of the Kumeyaay, the Spanish, and the Mexican inhabitants of early California. Students also "meet" real historic figures by dressing in costume as Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo, Father Junípero Serra, Guillermo Carrillo, Señorita Pico, and Josefa Carillo de Fitch.
